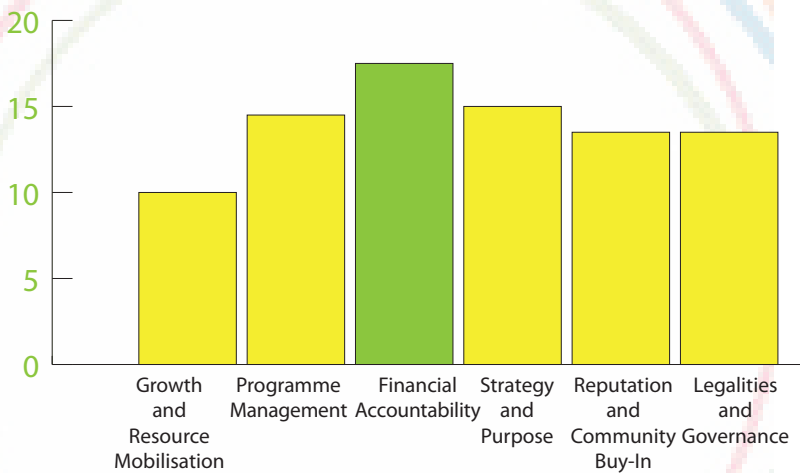

Its aim is to see the health of disadvantaged communities and people living in hard to reach places be protected, this is to facilitate improved livelihoods leading to poverty reduction at the individual, household and community level.

EAHP's purpose is to improve access to health promotion messages; contribute towards the reduction of maternal, newborn and infant morbidity and mortality; and increase access to sexual and reproductive health services.

However, EAHP needs to improve on monitoring and evaluation and needs to strengthen its resource mobilisation skills.
